Anthony Man-Son-Hing said that it is that same funding (\$143,000); WV, WI, IL all flat funding requested Discuss APHIS funding at annual board meeting. 2021 STS Grant All money requested from the states has now been sent out. Deobligations not occurring until June 2022 STS Budget Still don't have a federal budget. Modification submitted to the FS for approximately half of the Foundation's 2022 funds. This is due to the continuing resolution (CR). May have a budget possibly by the end of the week? CR allows for ½ the funds for the current agreement. If a state needs funds immediately they can submit now for consideration or wait until April or submit your letter. It would be either two awards from the foundation or wait until full funding. Decision is on the states. Forest Service doesn't do pre-awards. New grant package has to be approved. VA – Gypcheck 1st week of April. If you need your funding sooner than later, submit your needs now. It could potentially have considerable benefit in both reducing program costs while increasing effectiveness. Doing this would be a large undertaking might take 1-2 years for a postdoc to get meaningful results. Of course, they could simultaneously be working on smaller problems to support the program too.

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- Tom Coleman (FS) typically carves out 70K from the budget for research, but most is unused and directed to the racemic disparelure purchase or mating disruption treatment costs
- Think about this or vote?
 - Wait to hear from what Sandy says
- Discussion:
 - Phil Marshall (IN) suggested we get an economic analysis done. NCSU did the last analysis that is projected through 2026. Tom Coleman (FS) agrees it needs to be updated but should be separate work from the analyst position.
 - Tom Coleman (FS) would like to get this addressed before Sandy retires.
 - Mannin Dodd (VT) is supportive of the work from the Database side
- Gypcheck Tom Coleman (FS)
 - Tom Coleman (FS) found an old 2017 contract for Gypchek from Sylvar that none of us knew about.
 - Only used Sylvar for one year of production (sole source contract) and the contract has expired.
 - Company (Sylvar) that produced last batch of Gypchek has changed names to Andermatt, they can still produce Gypchek
 - FS has talked with APHIS (FPML Lab) and about rearing and then FS would process the caterpillars, FS/APHIS would need new lab equipment/techs/etc. Key positions are missing (Insect Pathologists)
 - John Kyhl is looking at the facility to see where it is and they are looking at trying to build the supply of product. Now is the time.
 - David Gianino (VA): Have to get a new contract?
 - Yes, others have been approached to see if they could produce this. Only Sylvar is willing. It will be more in cost but how much? Not sure at this point.
 - Phil Marshall (IN): Do we need to look at using this for more operational use to help keep the production steady?
 - Tom Coleman (FS) wants to see what the limits are on using the product so that we can build the data.
 - Phil Marshall (IN) said that IN would look further out in the action zone to apply Gypcheck to begin with until data says it can do otherwise.
- Indirect costs Tom Coleman (FS)
 - Georgia and Tom have reviewed the indirect costs policy set by the Foundation. All states are following guidance now of 15% indirect costs

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- It doesn't seem like all the states are taking advantage of this.
- For states with >15% negotiated indirect rates, states can carryover the unclaimed funds as state indirect costs. I'm not sure many are capturing these funds.
- These unclaimed funds (~\$350K) could match another ~\$1,000,000 in federal funds (if the funding comes available)
- Phil Marshall (IN), if we have this difference in overmatch it can help with states that aren't able to match.
- o Trap orders Tom Coleman (FS)
 - Initial orders are coming in, any issues let Tom know APHIS has been sending out trap orders. Tom wasn't aware it had started yet.
- o Calibration Fly-in Tom Coleman (FS)
 - March 30th 800am in Ovid, MI
